### God Wants To Be Known

The Old Testament reading from Deuteronomy praises God for inscribing the commandments in our very bodies. God's law is not distant or foreign, but a natural part of us. In his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul echoes Moses, praising God for becoming one of us. The truly human,

flesh-and-blood Jesus reminds us that God always wants to be recognizable and familiar to us. Jesus, who is also truly God, wants to be on intimate terms with each of us.

God's passionate desire to be known by us is almost too wonderful to take in. Luke's Gospel helps us understand how to respond. The Good Samaritan parable provides practical advice for those who believe in God's intimate love for them and want to share that love with others.

## Life of Stewardship

In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we read the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan. Here, Jesus teaches us in rich detail what stewardship in action looks like. In fact, this parable could just as accurately be called the parable of the Good Steward.

The first thing we note about the Good Samaritan is that he is aware of the needs of those around him and responds generously. While the priest and Levi brush right past the man on the side of the road, the Samaritan is watching for those who might be in need.


He has a hospitable way of looking at the world around him, and so, he is able to "see" in a way that the others did not, and he was "moved with compassion at the sight" of the man.

Next, we see the Good Samaritan spring into action to serve this man, setting aside his own schedule and plans in order to meet his needs. He does not just give the man a few dollars or offer some quick words of encouragement from across the road. He goes

right up to the man. He cleans and bandages his wounds. He puts the man on his own animal and brings him to an inn where he can heal. He ensures that the innkeeper would continue to look after him and he commits to returning to the man on his way back.

That is how we live out God's commandments. That is true hospitality and service. That is how a good steward springs into action when he comes upon a neighbor in need. And Jesus says to each of us personally, just as He did in today's Gospel, "Go and do likewise."

## Catholic Social Justice

The Word of God and the teachings of the Church give us a particular way of viewing the world. Scripture calls us to "choose life" to "serve the least of these," to "hunger and thirst" for justice and to be "peacemakers." Catholic teaching offers consistent principles to access issues, political platforms, and campaigns for their impact on human life and dignity. As Catholics, we are not free to abandon unborn children because they are seen as unwanted or inconvenient: to turn our backs on immigrants because they do not have the proper documents: to create and then destroy human lives in a quest for medical advances or profit; to turn away from poor women and children because they lack economic or political power; or to ignore sick people because they have no insurance. Nor can we neglect international responsibilities in the aftermath of war because resources are scarce. Catholic teaching requires us to speak up for the voiceless and act in accord with universal moral values."

around the Christian world by Irish monks on missionary journeys. By the eighth century, bells were standard equipment in even small parish churches. An ancient ceremony, once called the “baptism of the bells,” recognizes that the church bell has a voice to call people to awareness and summon them to worship, and even bestows a name on the bell.

In a world without clocks or watches, the bell had an indispensable role. For calling monks in from the fields for prayer, or alerting far-flung visitors, the bell’s voice was enhanced by hoisting it high into a tower. Soon it was learned that the sound of several bells clanging together in harmony imparted a sense of joy to great celebrations, and bell towers prospered, some chock full of bells. Different combinations of rings could indicate a death, a Mass, a wedding, a fast day, the curfew at the end of day, and the Angelus. Before electricity, bellringing was hard work indeed: the biggest bell in the Catholic world, in Cologne, Germany, weighs twenty-seven tons! There’s no substitute for the resonant roar of a mighty bell; electric chimes are not eligible for blessing!

## Saint of the Week—Bonaventure (ca. 1218—74)

*\*Following and leading*

According to legend, Francis of Assisi (October 4) named Bonaventure. Actually, his name was Giovanni di Fidenza. He became seriously ill when he was four years old, and his parents took him to the famous saint for possible healing. When the boy’s health returned, Francis exclaimed “Buona ventura” (good fortune).

Bonaventure entered the Franciscan Order in 1238 and rose to a position of leadership. It is difficult to imagine that Franciscans should have internal rivalries and opposition, but that was the case when Bonaventure joined them. Francis had died a decade earlier, and the Franciscans had split into factions. One group called themselves “Spirituals,” because they wanted to maintain the kind of poverty Francis practiced, and felt little need for centralized authority. Another group wanted to tone down the austerities and take a more causal approach. Bonaventure worked hard to pull both extremes toward an agreeable middle. His achievement was significant enough for him to attract the label of “second founder” of the Franciscans.

Bonaventure’s *The Mind’s Journey* into God attempts to express the experience of Francis in the form and language of philosophy. “*Happiness is the enjoyment of the highest good. Because the highest good is above us, we must rise above ourselves before we can be happy. This is a spiritual rather than a physical ascent, and we cannot rise above ourselves unless we are lifted by a power greater than ourselves.*”

*The Tree of Life* is a small devotional guidebook that leads readers in a meditation on the life of Christ. The experiences of Jesus, he writes, *are like the branches of a tree from which we can pluck valuable fruit, such as humility, holiness, patience, and faithfulness.* Bonaventure prayed, *Good Jesus, even though I do not deserve it, grant me the ability to ponder your experiences in my mind. I was not present at the cross, but let me pon-*

*der the house of your passion even as it was felt by your mother and penitent Magdalene.*

There is a wonderful moment a year before Bonaventure’s death that tells us as much about his personal character as any other single event. In 1273, Pope Gregory X appointed him cardinal-bishop of Albano. When the delegation arrived to deliver his red hat and other accoutrements of the office, Bonaventure was in the friary kitchen, washing dishes. He kept the astonished legates waiting until he finished his turn at kitchen duty. His working principle: “Religion is doing ordinary things perfectly.” If we cannot do great things, we can do regular things in a great way.


