

## Life of Stewardship

The four pillars of parish stewardship are hospitality, prayer, formation and service. Today's readings show us the immense value of prayer and the privileged place it must have in our individual lives and our in parish community.

Our Lord Himself calls us to prayer — and persistence in prayer

— in the Gospel passage from Luke. Jesus tells the parable of the nagging widow who finally wears down the judge with her unrelenting persistence in her pursuit of a just ruling from him on her behalf. Jesus goes to great lengths to describe this judge, saying he "neither feared God nor respected any human." Yet even this corrupt judge responds with a just judgment because of the widow's persistence.



Jesus uses this outlandish example to draw a vivid contrast between a reluctant, dishonest judge and our loving, all-merciful Father. If even a bad judge will give a good result in response to a persistent request, how much more (infinitely more) eagerly and perfectly will our good Father respond to our persistent prayers to Him.

If he delays in responding, if he provides a different response from the one we were expecting, we can remain confident and trusting in His goodness, knowing that His response, whenever it comes and in whatever form, will be the very best one for us.

Our job then, as Christian stewards, is simply to remain faithful to our relationship with God through prayer. We must lean on each other in our communities — family and parish — as we support each other in prayer. A strong pillar of prayer will make all our other stewardship efforts fruitful.

## Catholic Social Justice Climate Change and Catholic Social

Teaching

God has endowed humanity with reason and ingenuity that distinguish us from other creatures. Ingenuity and creativity have enabled us to make remarkable advances and can help us address the problem of global climate change: however, we have not always used these endowments wisely. Past actions have produced both good works and harmful ones, as well as unforeseen consequences. Now we face two central moral questions:

- 1. How are we to fulfill God's call as stewards of creation in an age when we may have the creativity to alter that creation significantly, and perhaps irrevocably?
- 2. How can we as a "family of nations" exercise stewardship in a way that respects and protects the integrity of God's creation?

### **Global Solidarity Ministry**

"As Christmas is fast approaching, the Global Solidarity Ministry of St. Michael the Archangel Church once again is making an appeal for your donations to support the two projects it has been supporting in the Philippines. The first one is the solid waste dumpsite community in Quezon City called Payatas whose residents make their living by scavenging the dumpsite for items that they could sell like empty plastic bottles and discarded household items. On Christmas day, the Bishop of the Diocese of Novaliches, Quezon City come to a chapel in Payatas and celebrate mass with about 300 families followed by giftgiving and a simple meal. About \$10.00 is allocated for each family or a total of \$3,000.

The other project is the support of the Home of Love in Cebu. This place houses about 50 former victims of prostitution and human trafficking as well as their children. The Home of Love is run by the nuns from the Mary Queen of Heaven Missionaries. In the past year, Global Solidarity Ministry provided \$2,000 to help the residents who are studying to pay for transportation and meals in school. The donations are also used to buy clothes and hygiene products.

Your donations will go a long way in improving the lives of these impoverished and very deserving people in the Philippines." —*Lito Ilagan*

# Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

While this very important celebration is usually on December 8th, since that is a Sunday this year, all the Masses for December 7th/8th will be for the Second Sunday of Advent. Although the Paulist Press Ordo says it is not a holy day of obligation this year, since the Diocese of Honolulu only celebrates two holy days of obligation throughout the year (Immaculate Conception and Christmas), the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception WILL be celebrated on Monday, December 9th, as a <u>HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION</u> in the Diocese of Honolulu. Masses will be held at *7am and 12noon at St. Michael's*.

#### **Treasures From Our Tradition**

Although the hours of daylight are rapidly dwindling, many people would say that these October days bring the year's most splendid weather. Americans are riders and joggers, not strollers, and so the pleasures of the season are often lost on us. This is not the case with many Jewish people, who observe an ancient rule in walking to synagogue on the Sabbath. On city streets and suburban sidewalks in many cities, we may notice around sunset the nicely dressed families walking and chatting on Friday afternoon. After a short prayer at dusk, the families stroll home again for a relaxing and festive meal. They return to synagogue in the morning, and then spend an afternoon in family leisure until three stars appear in the night sky and Sabbath ends.

Catholics, on the other hand, pile into the car and drive even a short distance to Mass; some even divide the family to participate at different hours. For Jews, the leisurely walk marks a dividing line between hectic life commitments and a day of abundant joy and enrichment. Before we became an automobile culture, Catholics embraced a similar pace, and in most places walked to church. These lovely days of fall invite us to tap into an old and life-giving tradition. If you live within a mile of your church, walk next week. If you must drive, park at a good distance and walk the rest of the way. Talk about your life, greet strangers, notice the crunch of leaves under your shoes. You may be surprised at how different Sunday Mass feels when it is framed by leisure!

### Saint John of Capistrano—(1386—1456)

\*Patron of judges, lawyers and military chaplains

St. John was born at Capistrano, Italy in 1385, the son of a former German knight in that city. He studied law at the University of Perugia and practiced as a lawyer in the courts of Naples. King Ladislas of Naples appointed him governor of Perugia. During a war with a neighboring town he was betrayed and imprisoned. Upon his release he entered the Franciscan community at Perugia in 1416. He and St. James of the March were fellow students under St. Bernardine of Siena, who inspired him to institute the devotion to the holy Name of Jesus and His Mother. John began his brilliant preaching apostolate with a deacon in 1420. After his ordination he traveled throughout Italy, Germany, Bohemia, Austria, Hungary, Poland, and Russia preaching penance and establishing numerous communities of Franciscan renewal. When Mohammed II was threatening Vienna and Rome, St. John, at the age of seventy, was commissioned by Pope Callistus III to preach and lead a crusade against the invading Turks. Marching at the head of seventy thousand Christians, he gained victory in the great battle of Belgrade against the Turks in 1456. Three months later he died at Illok, Hungary. His feast day is October 23rd. He is the patron of jurists.
